Community testing in your area

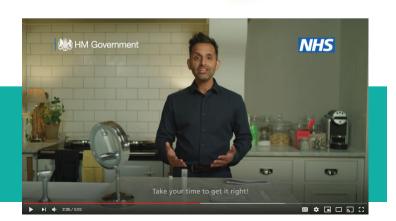
Council staff are in your area today, talking to you and your neighbours about taking a test for Coronavirus.

Testing is one of the best ways that we can beat this virus. Even if you don't have symptoms, please get tested – this will help us to track cases and control the spread of Coronavirus.

What happens?

- 1. We knock on your door and answer any questions you have about testing
- 2. We leave a home test kit for every household member even children
- 3. You take the test at home*
- 4. We call back later to collect completed test kits
- 5. You get your result within 48 hours
- *If you're unsure of taking the test yourself, you can ask for help.

What happens if I test positive?

If you get a positive test result, you must self-isolate at home for 10 days – even if you have no symptoms.

Members of your household must self-isolate for 14 days, even if they get a negative result. This is because you could have passed on the virus to them after they took their test.

Test & Trace

If you tested positive for Coronavirus, you will get a phone call from the NHS Test & Trace team.

- Look out for a call from 0300 013 5000
- Please be honest and give them the names and phone numbers of your social contacts and activity over the past seven days this will help control the spread of the virus
- If they can't reach you after 24 hours, the Council's Test & Trace team will call you this call will be from a local 01254 number
- If they can't reach you by phone, a member of our team will come to your home to speak to you.
